

## **Significant Emergency Incidents**

### **Structure Fire**

**155 Live Oak Street, January 11<sup>th</sup>**- At 3:54 a.m., Battalion 1215 and Engine 1284 responded a report of a possible attic fire. Units arrived at scene and found light smoke inside the structure. Engine 1284 quickly located and extinguished the fire in the attic significantly limiting damage to the remainder of the structure.

- November 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup>, 30<sup>th</sup> - Kinder Morgan provided refresher training to firefighters on incidents involving the Kinder Morgan Pipeline. The pipeline transports various petroleum products through the City on its way to Nevada.
- December 1<sup>st</sup> - Auburn Fire members and Hook & Ladder Company #1 members participated in the Festival of Lights Parade. This event brings nearly 15,000 patrons into the City. Additional engine companies were brought in to prepare for the event, which nearly splits the City into two sections.
- December 5<sup>th</sup> - Boys and Girls club station tour. B-shift (Captain Meier & company) hosted a station tour for 10 boys and girls. Fire safety and calling 911 for emergencies were some of the subjects covered.
- December 8<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> - Auburn Fire members and Hook & Ladder Company #1 members participated in the Old Town Classic Christmas. The famous firehouse chowder was sold out both nights by 6:30pm!
- December 9<sup>th</sup> – Engine 1285 (Captain Rogers & company) and Battalion 1215 (John Rogers) attended the Downtown Auburn Family Christmas Festival. Many children and adults were provided with a tour of the fire engine and holiday fire safety information.
- December 16<sup>th</sup> – Auburn Fire Department hosted Ben Vernon of the San Diego Fire Department who presented a PTSD and Workplace Violence Seminar to our members and surrounding public safety agencies at Station 1.
- December 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> – Santa toured on a fire engine around the City of Auburn with C Shift (Captain Rogers & Company) and Battalion 1217 (Zaucha).
- December 20<sup>th</sup> - Battle of the Badges occurred in front of Savemart to see which department could raise more funds for the Salvation Army. Rescue 1252 (Sims and Hess) rang the bell and collected donations.
- January 2<sup>nd</sup> - C Shift (Captain Rogers & company) took a local daycare for a tour at firehouse #2.
- January 26<sup>th</sup> - Auburn Fire personnel along with community volunteers completed fuel reduction work above the City parking lot on Blocker Drive. The property now stands out as an example for a successful shaded fuel break effort.
