Natural Disaster

160 Wescott Court, February 26th- During severe inclement weather at approximately 1am a 120ft cedar tree fell on a residence causing significant damage. Fortunately no-one was injured. Engine 1285 removed the tree from the roof, secured the roof from further water damage, and returned to service to continue to run calls throughout the night.

Vehicle Into a Building

303 Sacramento Street, February 3rd- At approximately 1pm a vehicle struck the front side of 7-Eleven convenience store causing moderate damage to the store and vehicle. Fortunately there were no injuries. Engine 1285 and BC 1215 arrived at scene and secured the building. After the building owner arrived and we determined the building to be safe, all fire units cleared.
