NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a General Municipal Election will be held in the City of Auburn on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, for the following Officers and Measure:

Member of the City Council	Full term of four (4) years
Member of the City Council	Full term of four (4) years
City Treasurer	Full term of four (4) years
Ballot Measure S (Transactions and Use Tax)	

Shall the measure to increase funding for general fund purposes in the City of Auburn such as increased fire, police, and code enforcement services, with all funds staying local and all expenditures subject to an annual audit and oversight by a Citizens' Oversight Committee, levying a 1 percent sales tax and raising approximately \$2,560,000 annually, which will automatically expire in seven years unless extended by voters, be adopted? The nomination period for these offices begins on July 13, 2020 and closes on August 7, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.

If nomination papers for an incumbent officer of the City are not filed by August 7, 2020 (the 88th day before the election), the voters shall have until August 12, 2020 (the 83rd day before the election) to nominate candidates other than the person(s) who are the incumbents on August 7, 2020 (the 88th day before the election), for that incumbent's elective office. This extension is not applicable where there is no incumbent eligible to be elected.

If no one or only one person is nominated for an elective office, appointment to the elective office may be made as prescribed by Section 10229 of the California Elections Code.

The in-person voting locations will be open for at least 8 hours on election day as well as the three days prior to election day. Please check with Placer County for Voter Assistance Center locations.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that pursuant to Article 4, Chapter 3, Division 9 of the California Elections Code, the legislative body of the City, or any member or members thereof authorized by the body, or any individual voter or bona fide association of citizens, or any combination of voters and associations, may file a written argument, not to exceed 300 words in length, accompanied by the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the author(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers who is the author of the argument, for or against the City measure.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that, based upon the time reasonably necessary to prepare and print the arguments and sample ballots for the election, the City Clerk has fixed not later than August 7, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. during normal office hours, as posted, as the date after which no arguments for or against the City measure may be submitted to the City Clerk for printing and distribution to the voters as provided in the Article 4. Arguments shall be submitted to the City Clerk at City Hall located at 1225 Lincoln Way, Auburn CA 95603, accompanied by the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the author(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers who is the author of the argument. Arguments may be changed or withdrawn until and including the date fixed by the City Clerk.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the City Council has determined that rebuttal arguments, not to exceed 250 words in length, as submitted by the authors of the opposing direct arguments, may be submitted to the City Clerk not later than August 17, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. at City Hall located at 1225 Lincoln Way, Auburn CA 95603, accompanied by the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the author(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an

organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers who is the author of the argument.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN if more than one argument for or more than one argument against any City measure is submitted, the City Clerk shall select one of the arguments in favor and one argument against the measure, as set forth in Section 9287 of the California Elections Code.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that any ordinance, impartial analysis, or direct argument filed under the authority of the California Elections Code will be available for public examination in the City Clerk's Office for not less than 10-calendar days from the deadline for the filing of the arguments and analysis(es). Any rebuttal argument filed under the authority of the California Elections Code will be available for public examination in the City Clerk's Office for not less than 10-calendar days from the deadline for filing rebuttal arguments.
