

News & Events

1. The Auburn Fire Department received \$49,500 from the Middle Fork American River Hydroelectric Project towards fuel reduction efforts, to be used in the Eagles Nest area along the Auburn Shaded Fuel Break.
2. Letters continue to be received from residents of Auburn to ensure compliance to Wildland Urban Interface code requirements. Responses have been favorable and have greatly increased public education efforts.

Significant Emergency Incidents

Vehicle Accident

West Bound I-80 at Elm Avenue, May 11th – At 17:50 Auburn Fire Department responded to a reported vehicle accident on West Bound I-80 at Elm Avenue. Auburn Fire units arrived at scene and found a single vehicle into the guardrail with major damage. Auburn Fire units assessed the vehicle and found two patients; one trapped in the vehicle with major injuries and the other self-extricated with minor injuries. Auburn Fire units extricated the patient by removing the driver's side front and rear doors. Auburn Fire transferred care to AMR and assisted with loading the patients for transport. Both patients were transported to Sutter Roseville Medical Center, one code 3 with an Auburn Firefighter on-board. West bound I-80 traffic was impacted for the duration of the incident including clean-up.

Agency Assist

1215 Lincoln Way, June 1st – At 11:30 Auburn Fire Department went into unified command with APD in preparation for protests occurring within the City of Auburn. Fire resources from CAL FIRE, Newcastle Fire, and Placer Hills Fire were staged along with Auburn Fire resources should any incidents occur. In total there were three protests that occurred on various days. All of which were peaceful with no reported incidents.

Structure Fire

201 Poet Smith Drive, June 9th – At 21:44 Auburn Fire Department responded to a residential structure fire at 201 Poet Smith Drive. E1284 arrived at scene and found an exterior fire in a carport with extension into the structure's attic. E1284 deployed a hose line and made an aggressive fire attack from the exterior progressing into the house, while securing a water supply from a nearby hydrant. B1216 arrived, assumed Poet IC, and established the Incident Command Post. E1285 arrived at scene and conducted a primary and secondary search of the residence and obtained an all clear 14 minutes after dispatch. E1284 was able to hold the fire to the Alpha side of the building with minimal extension through the attic limiting fire growth and minimizing property damage/loss.
