The aim of neighborhood watch includes educating residents of a community on security and safety and achieving safe and secure neighborhoods. However, when a criminal activity is suspected, members are encouraged to report to authorities, and not to intervene. *Request Starter kit from Auburn Police Department.*

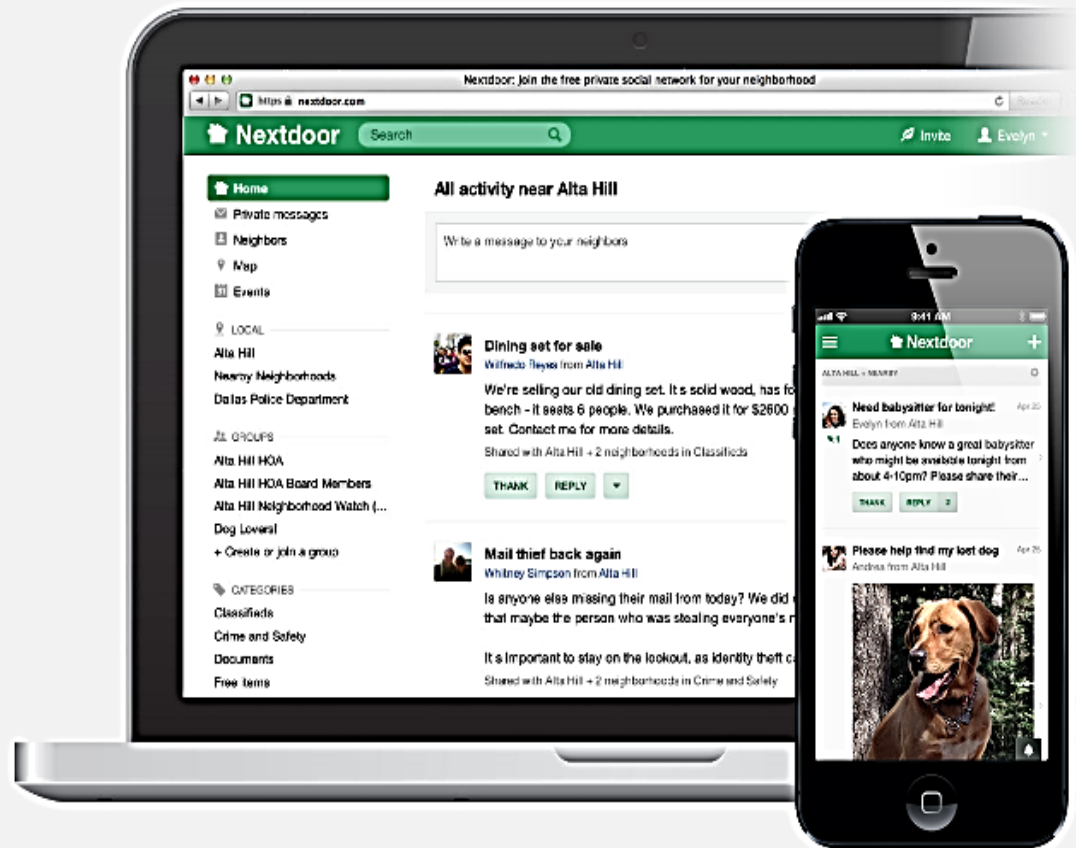

How does it work?

Neighbors who know each other, look out for each other.

**93%**

say it's important for neighbors to look out for one another.

Over **67%** of homeowners feel safer when they know their neighbors.



**35%**

of people who know their neighbors reported that they've shared information with them about crime & safety.

**79%** of people that use an online neighborhood forum talk with their neighbors in-person at least once a month.

# See Something Post Something!

What are the advantages of implementing Virtual Neighborhood Watch?

- The ability to implement a neighborhood watch program without having to attend regular meetings, which should increase participation.
- The opportunity to get to know your neighbors thru social media.
- The ability to disseminate (post) information quickly and effectively to all neighbors at once or just your neighborhood (Geo-targeting).
- The ability to post urgent alerts specific to your neighborhood e.g. Suspicious Activity- Lock-up properties, cars and animals - SHELTER IN PLACE.



Are there types of posts that are **NOT** appropriate for Social Media?

- Posting request for emergency services • Posting Vacation Plans
- Posting requesting police services • Posting criminal to law enforcement

## Auburn Police Department (APD) to Neighborhood Posting

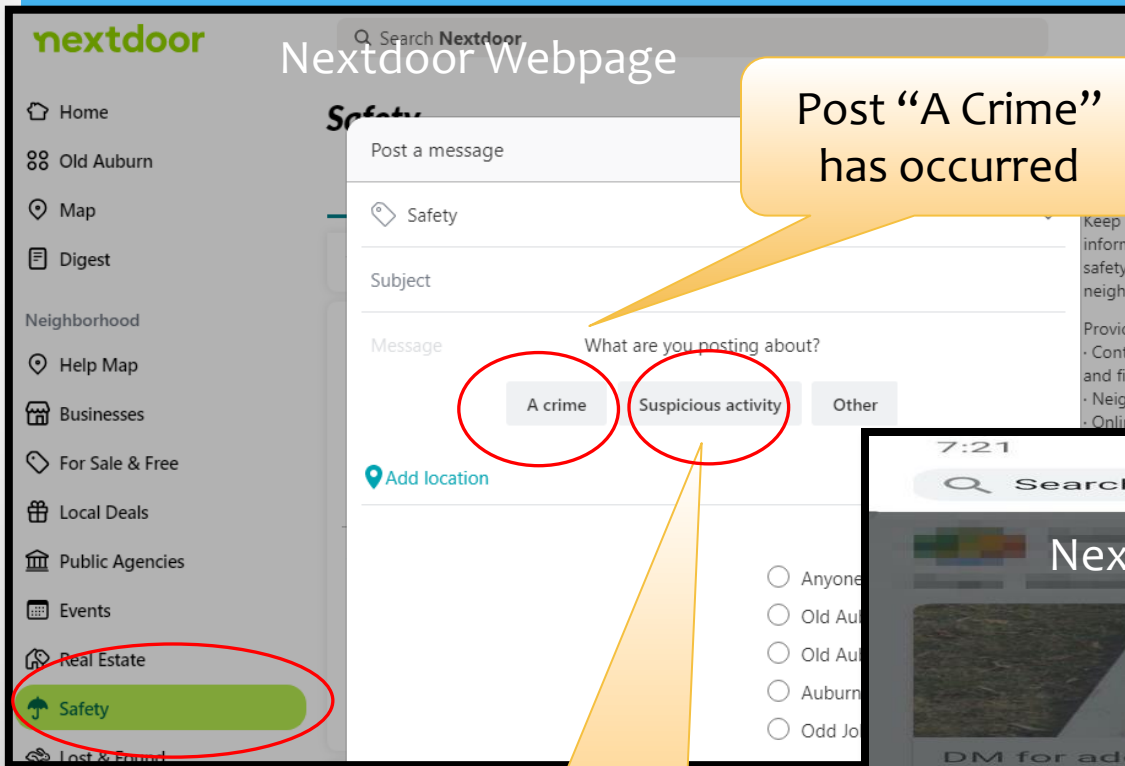


- Post Crime prevention & safety tips
- Post upcoming Public or City events
- Post Emergency Notifications
- Post New Services e.g. Neighborhood Crime Reports

## Neighbor to Neighbor Posting

- Posting information about crime and safety issues in the neighborhood.
- Post best home safety equipment or services (see [Safewise.com](https://www.safewise.com)).
- Post & discuss issues or nuisances in the neighborhood.
- Spread the word of neighborhood or city events and safety classes.
- Provide support to fellow members in need.
- Post the available services offered by APD e.g. Elderly ID Program, Security Camera Registration, Vacation Checks or Extra Patrol in neighborhood.
- Post missing persons or pets.

## Watch Captain Role

- Communicate Be a Good Neighbor Activities – vacation checks, trash can return, pickup newspapers, and offer secondary delivery location.
- Hold Virtual Meeting Zoom and Teleconference with VWC invite Neighborhood Officer
- Host Face to Face Meeting once a year National Night Out with Neighborhood Officer
- Request Extra Patrols and Vacation Checks (submit via APD Webpage).
- Join or create Facebook Neighborhood Watch groups
- Track & report Nextdoor participation rates.
- Encourage neighbors to register cameras with APD. Assist in video retrieval from neighborhoods from incident in neighborhood.
- You'll have to pass a background check . ??
- Reach consensus in the neighborhood to install Watch Signs & decals.
